Weekly Police Blotter

1/15/23-1/21/23

- **1/17/2023 Aggravated Assault, 05:26 PM (Prospect Avenue):** Officers responded to Prospect Avenue on a report of a fight. A suspect was arrested for attempting to attack two victims with a machete over a parking dispute.
- **1/18/2023 Shoplifting, 01:41 PM (Hackensack Avenue):** Police responded to a report of a group of shoplifters that allegedly stole numerous handbags from a retail store. The retail value of the handbags totaled \$31,300. The incident is currently under investigation.
- **1/19/2023 Theft, 03:53 PM (Euclid Avenue):** A victim reported that unknown suspects stole the catalytic converter from his vehicle. The vehicle was parked on Euclid Avenue and the suspected theft may have occurred during the overnight hours. The incident is currently under investigation.
- **1/19/2023 Suspicious Incident, 11:14 PM (South River Street):** A customer attempted to use an ATM at a local convenience store on South River Street. The customer found a skimmer device and turned it over to the store manager. Video surveillance captured a suspect placing the device on the ATM. The incident is currently under investigation.
- **1/20/2023 Burglary, 08:13 AM (Mary Street):** A complainant reported to police that an apartment complex was broken into by a suspect on Mary Street. The suspect broke a window using his elbow and gained access to a mail area of a complex where he stole several items. The incident is currently under investigation.
- **1/20/2023 Theft, 11:05 AM (Clinton Place):** The victim reported that he parked his vehicle on Clinton Place. When he returned to his vehicle and started it, the vehicle was making a strange noise. Upon inspecting the vehicle, the victim noticed that the catalytic converter was missing. The incident is currently under investigation.
- **1/20/2023 Warrant Arrest (Main Street):** While patrolling the area of Main Street, officers observed a vehicle to be double parked. They located the operator of the vehicle who happened to have an outstanding warrant. The operator was arrested on the warrant. The vehicle was impounded for being unregistered and having fictitious plates. Several summonses were issued.
