Weekly Police Blotter

7/16/23-7/22/23

- **7/16/2023 Shoplifting/Warrant Arrest, 6:45 PM (River Street South):** Security from a local supermarket detained a suspect that stole various food items. The suspect also provided false information to officers. An active warrant was located upon confirmation of the suspect's identification. He was arrested and transported to Bergen County Jail.
- **7/18/2023 Motor Vehicle Theft, 7:53 PM (Beech Street):** The victim reported that she parked her vehicle on Beech Street on the evening of 7/17/2023 and returned the following evening to find it missing. This incident is currently under investigation.
- **7/18/2023 City Ordinance Violation, 9:56 AM (Columbus Park):** While conducting a check of Columbus Park, an officer observed two males underneath the gazebo that were drinking alcoholic beverages. The two males were issued city ordinance violation and were dispersed.
- **7/18/2023 Recovered Stolen Auto, 9:46 AM (Hamilton Place):** An officer responded to a report of an abandoned vehicle. Upon further investigation, it was discovered that the vehicle was reported stolen out of Newark, NJ. Newark PD was notified and the vehicle was recovered.
- **7/19/2023 City Ordinance Violation, 2:45 PM (Anderson Street):** While conducting a routine check of the area of Anderson Street, an officer observed a suspect drinking in public. The suspect was issued a city ordinance violation and dispersed.
- **7/22/2023 Receiving Stolen Property, 11:07 PM (Holt Street):** An officer conducted a motor vehicle stop after observing the suspect driving a stolen vehicle. The driver and a passenger were arrested and charged with receiving stolen property.
