The circumstances were unknown as to what caused the death and as such, the Detective Bureau and Bergen County Sheriff BCI were contacted and responded. No obvious signs of foul play were observed. Investigation to continue.
- **8/14/2023 Theft, 10:36 AM (Fairmount Avenue):** The complainant reported that his amazon package was reported as delivered to the lobby of his building on Fairmount Avenue. When he responded to retrieve his package, he was unable to locate it. The incident is under investigation.
- **8/14/2023 Theft, 12:31 PM (Polifly Road):** A victim reported that they had their electric bicycle locked to a bike rack in the common garage of an apartment complex on Polifly Road. The electric bicycle was stolen from the bike rack. The incident is under investigation.
- **8/15/2023 Burglary, 4:17 PM (Banta Place):** A victim reported that an unknown person entered her apartment and stole miscellaneous items totaling \$275. The incident is under investigation.
- **8/17/2023 Criminal Mischief, 07:30 AM (Johnson Avenue):** Multiple vehicles that were parked during the overnight hours on Johnson Avenue had their tires slashed by unknown suspect(s). The incident is under investigation.
