Weekly Police Blotter

10/29/23-11/4/23

- **10/31/2023 Theft of Package, 1:19 PM (Linden Street):** A victim reported that an unknown person stole her package from the front lobby of her building on Linden Street. The incident is under investigation.
- **11/01/2023 Theft of Packages, 2:39 PM (Henry Place):** A victim reported that an unknown suspect stole numerous packages from his door step. The incident is under investigation.
- **11/01/2023 Criminal Mischief, 10:51 PM (Hudson Street):** While patrolling the area of Hudson Street, a patrol officer observed the front glass of a business that was shattered. The front glass appeared to have been smashed in with a rock. Video surveillance revealed that a male had thrown a rock through the window and remained in the area of Hudson Street. The suspect was located. The incident is currently under investigation.
- **11/02/2023 Arrest, 11:29 AM (Jackson Avenue):** A patrol officer observed a vehicle disregard a red traffic signal on Jackson Avenue and conducted a motor vehicle stop. It was determined that the driver had a suspended driver's license. The vehicle was towed due to the driver's inability to contact a licensed driver and the fact that it would have been a hazard if left where the stop occurred. Shortly after, the driver responds to police headquarters in an attempt to obtain a tow release. In the process, the driver presented a fraudulent driver's license in an attempt to have his vehicle released. The driver was placed under arrest for displaying false government documents to a police officer. A search incident to arrest revealed narcotics and a large amount of U.S currency. Both were seized. The driver was given additional charges for Possession and Distributing a controlled dangerous substance.
- **11/04/2023 Shoplifting, 2:48 PM (Hackensack Avenue):** Security from a high-end shop reported that a suspect entered their store on Hackensack Avenue and stole approximately \$3,700 worth of merchandise in approximately 20 seconds. The suspect entered an unknown vehicle and fled the area. The incident is under investigation.
